## Norton Rose Fulbright (NRF) Insight Day – MyBigCareer

A group of our Year 10 students were fortunate enough to visit global law firm Norton Rose Fulbright on Wednesday. The aim of the day was to increase knowledge of pathways into, and careers within, law firms and to develop employability skills (interviews, project work, application writing) as well as increasing the confidence of students to demonstrate those skills.

Our students found out about NRF and the many roles within their firm as well as examples of case studies, to bring to life the work NRF do. All students then had to prepare a one minute elevator pitch with the support of NRF, to include their background and experience, which they then used to network with many of the employees within the firm. Students rounded off the day by acting as NRF employees to advise a company on where they should open their new office, culminating in a pitch to representatives from NRF who acted as the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer of 'Starfish'.

A huge thank you to MyBigCareer for providing this opportunity and the many NRF corporate volunteers who took so much of their time to interact and network with our students.
